






Dear friends,

I had the privilege this Wednesday to attend the Memorial Service of Laura Kelly, Pastor of the Caledonia Church of God. I know it may seem odd, even a bit unfeeling to characterize a funeral as a privilege, but that is the best way I have to describe the hope and peace Laura's service gave my spirit this week. I had met Laura only a few times, most recently at our Cal-Mum World Day of Prayer Service. I sat just two seats away from her during worship that evening, and can still hear her passion-filled voice singing "*It Is Well With My Soul*". It was a privilege to sing with her that evening and a joy to join with members of her congregation on Wednesday as they gave thanks to God for the gift of her life and ministry.

In just a few weeks, we will enter into Holy Week and mark the last days Jesus spent walking among us. Holy Week is a week of great emotions, both joyful and sorrowful. Over the years, I've heard plenty of clergy lay the Holy Week guilt trip on pretty thick. I'm guessing many of you have as well. "You cannot have Easter without Good Friday", we have been reminded. While I don't disagree with this sentiment, I sometimes worry that we can lose sight of Holy Week's central message.


We celebrate Holy Week, not Hazing Week. I do not believe that you and I are called to suffer through Holy Week in order to manufacture a blessed Easter morning. Holy Week, I think, distills the core witness of our faith. Professor Mark Brummitt, a friend and colleague, sums it up this way, "The miracle of Christianity is that the very worst can become the very best." I think Mark gets it just right. Darkness breaks and makes way for the dawn. Death loses its sting and makes way for eternal life and the glory of God in heaven. Christ is alive and present in all aspects of our lives, both the highs and the lows.

We have several services throughout Holy Week to help you enter into Jesus' story. Each time we gather, we will reflect on how and where God was present in Jesus' final days, and how and where God continues to be present in our day. God is present in the warmth and sunlight that has finally begun to creep our way. Yet God is also present and responsive in the bitter cold and the darkness of the night. God was present last month when Jenny and I celebrated our son's first birthday. Yet God was also present and alive last Wednesday in a funeral service. That is the miracle of our faith, the miracle of Jesus, that the very worst can become the very best.

The very worst becomes the very best this Holy Week. May God bless you and those you hold dear during this Holy season, and lead you to a joyful Easter morning. See you in church!

Last month I tagged along with Steve on one of his always action-packed trips - six nights, three hotels – you get the picture.

We had left on a Sunday after church and were on the second leg of the journey – Atlanta to Orlando – when, just before the doors closed, a gentleman rushed in and took the seat beside me. There is no need for hymnals – music texts are flashed on a large screen above the altar for all to see.

On this Sunday, my travel companion had made a video recording of his church's arrangement of “The Church's One Foundation”. To me it was joyous, but almost unrecognizable. (Drums? Tambourines?)

That same morning, the Grace Choir was singing “Amazing Grace”, and Rob Kelly had made a video recording for me on my tablet. (I have never done this before, or since.) I'm sure my companion's reaction to our music was similar to my reaction! However, as we continued our conversation, we realized that each of our churches has a place in God's universe.



AMAZING GRACE

Our Own Novelist

Not every columnist has an easier task than writing about one's roommate, nor a tougher slog than attempting a suitably literary biography of a gifted writer.

Barbara Jean Dimmick wanted to tell stories in writing from early primary school. Mom was her first audience. She helped and encouraged the little girl, who kept at it through occasional publications into high school where an English teacher recognized a rare talent and gave her significant editing time and valuable advice.

Barbara had other interests, too. Horseback riding competed with writing. She worked in a local stable in exchange for saddle time; occasionally writing newspaper and magazine articles about the sport. By the time she reached college she decided to go into equine veterinary medicine, and the writing progress stopped. She spent more than a year training at one of the country's best riding schools. With this experience she made her post-college living teaching riding in numerous camps and schools, colleges and stables in her home state of Pennsylvania and in New York. But notably enough, her diploma from the University of New Hampshire said "Creative Writing" as the field of study.

After she married in her late twenties she decided to listen to an inner voice telling her not to abandon writing, and to be the best she could be at her earliest passion. Gone was the desire to follow veterinary medicine. She returned to New Hampshire for a master's degree in creative writing. With that she obtained a job in a New Hampshire Junior College, and she and her husband built a home "off the grid" in Central Vermont. The two separated and divorced, and Barbara now had time to give most of her time to writing. Her stories and essays were being published and then, after writing two or three earlier novels or parts, she wrote *In the Presence of Horses* which was a publishing success. The money gave her the flexibility to move into a "regular" home with electricity, leave her New Hampshire college job and do research into the life of a first century holy person, Saint Barbara. A light-hearted book of the saint's life is now finished in draft and is in the hands of Barbara's editor. She is confident of its future.

During this period, Barbara accepted a job from Dartmouth College in the Creative Writing Department as a Visiting Professor. There she met an alumnus who had signed up for a summer writing group chaired by her. Two year's writing training was followed by an indescribable, long-distance courtship and a Moravian wedding to the same alumnus in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania.


After the marriage, Barbara underwent a huge change of life style. She left her beloved Vermont and New Hampshire and lots of friends. She married a man with a marriage history. She suddenly had six stepdaughters and numerous grandchildren from 28 to one in age. And she adopted the Episcopal Church, attending a congregation where at the outset no one knew her. Oh, yes: and she married a Republican.

He is grateful, and says prayers of thanksgiving every morning. One of the stepdaughters said to Barbara recently, "You are the best thing that ever happened to Dad."

Dick and Shirley Korhumel Celebrate 50 Years of Ministry Celebration








Ladies' Luncheon at Grace

GRACE CHURCH Building and Grounds for March Pete Haake

The church roof project is just about to get underway.

The notice to contractors is going out soon and we expect that the bids will be in by the end of the month.


So far there are 5 bidders to be contacted and the bidding will be through Bero Architecture LLP. There may be several more bidders as well. We expect the roof to be on this summer .

The estimate is for about 50 squares (5000 square feet) and for repair of the bell tower copper that has a defect that has allowed it to leak.

The Cost has been estimated to be over \$50,000. A capital campaign will begin when we gather all information needed.

We have a site visit scheduled on 3/26/14 for Colleen Heemeyer from the Sacred Sites foundation who we have applied to for financial support. The amount that we have applied for is partially dependent on how much we can raise on our own.


We will have to have significant funds from our own in house capital campaign. If you would like to make a contribution contact Chris, Liz or any Vestry member.
